

OSC Enforcement Branch: Litigation





The OSC recently introduced no-contest settlements, which allow alleged wrongdoers to settle without formally having to admit wrongdoing. There are strict eligibility requirements (e.g., not for serious misconduct). In 2015, the OSC approved the first two no-contest settlements.


The Joint Serious

What's Ahead for 2016:



The OSC is seeking an amendment to the Criminal Code so wiretaps can be used for insider trading and tipping offences.



The OSC plans to implement its Whistleblower Program and begin to use the information from the program to pursue potential cases.



The OSC will complete the enhanced Multilateral Memorandum of Understanding to enable extra-provincial information sharing and cross-border enforcement activities.
