Five questions to ask a freelance paralegal or paralegal support service

- 1. What type of projects/services are you available for?
- 2. If we move forward, how do we get started?
- 3. How do you ensure compliance with confidentiality rules?
- 4. How do you ensure security of confidential data?
- 5. What processes do you have that help ensure adequate attorney supervision over work product?

It doesn't take much conversation to determine whether someone is tech savvy and securityconscience, how they handle supervision, and whether their ideals align with those of your own practice. Pick the company you're most comfortable with and simply start with a small project to ease into the support.
