JUDGMENTS

Northern Territory

1 September 2014 - Inquest into the death of Braden (aka* Braydon)(Kwementyaye) Brown [2014] NTMC 019

Mr Brown was a 17 year old who suffered from bacterial meningitis. He presented to his local clinic on three occasions. By the second presentation, his symptoms were sufficient to require further testing. Such testing could have led to early recognition of meningitis. No testing was undertaken until Mr Brown's condition was so severe that he was retrieved by the Royal Flying Doctor and taken to the Alice Springs Hospital. There were a number of reasons for the delay, one of which was that the treating doctor was unable to contact anybody outside his clinic to consult as to the required steps for treatment.

The Coroner made a number of recommendations to the Northern Territory Department of Health.

Firstly, the Coroner recommended that the Northern Territory required tele-health facilities to ensure that staff working in remote clinics have access to other facilities, outside of their clinics. This would have reduced the delay in providing treatment to Mr Brown. Secondly, the Coroner recommended that changes be made to the Central Australia Rural Practitioners Association Manual so that it better assists practitioners to diagnose and treat meningitis. Finally, the Coroner recommended that all clinical staff were to undergo regular training and up-skilling within their scope of practice. He recommended that they should undergo training to highlight conditions that they are unlikely to encounter in routine practice.

This inquest highlighted some significant challenges faced by medical practitioners in rural areas.

New South Wales (NSW)

2 September 2014 - AJD v Royal Prince Alfred Hospital [2014] NSWCATAD 125

AJD (the Applicant) sought a review of conduct by the Royal Prince Alfred Hospital (the Alfred) under the Health Privacy Principles (HPP).

AJD's primary submission was that the Alfred Hospital disclosed her health information without her consent when it released health records of her children to their father. She argued that the Alfred was only authorised to release the part of the records that contained her children's health information, not the part that contained her health information.

The Tribunal considered whether the information in question was actually AJD's information or the children's information. The information at the centre of this dispute was that AJD suffered from a serious chronic illness. Evidence showed that AJD's health information was relevant to the provision of a health service to one of her children. The Tribunal said that to the extent that this information was relevant to the provision of that health services to her child, it could also be classified as the health information of that child. In other words, because this information also constituted the child's health information, the Alfred had not breached the HPP by providing a copy of this information to the father.

The Tribunal also held that other aspects of AJD's health information included on the children's records were neither relevant nor necessary for the care and treatment of the children. In relation to this information, the Alfred was in breach of the HPP.
