However, the opportunity has now been widened to potentially all maintained schools, provided that the applicant school teams up with an 'outstanding' school.

Academy Fast Facts

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Academies:

- are opting out of local authority control;
- receive their funding directly from the Government;
- have greater control over their budget;
- can buy in the services they need from providers of their choice;
- are not bound by the National Curriculum and can set up their own curriculum (except in core subjects such as Maths and English);
- can set levels of teacher's wages and benefits;
- can alter term length and timing of school days;
- can set their own admissions policy (providing it is in accordance with the Schools Admissions Code);
- can benefit from support of personal or corporate sponsors,
 financially or in kind.

Becoming an Academy Legal Considerations

Academy Trust

This body must be registered with Companies House. A company limited by guarantee will be set up. This involves drafting Memorandum of Association and Articles of Association. You should be aware of the legal implications of setting up a company.

Consultation Process

Schools have flexibility in how and when they run the consultation process, but legal advice may be required to assist in managing the process.

Bank Account

A new bank account needs to be established for the Academy Trust.

Land, Buildings and Assets

These will need to be transferred to the Academy. A Report on Title needs to be prepared following conduct of the appropriate searches.

Contracts/Insurance/Agreements

The new Academy will need to transfer, renew, purchase or procure new contracts, insurance, agreements, etc as required.

Employees

Staff will have to be transferred to the new Academy, observing requirements under TUPE. Consideration should be paid to obtaining indemnities from the Local Authority if there are any existing employment disputes.

Admissions Policy

Academies can set their own admissions policy. However, this must be in accordance with the Schools Admission Code. It may be prudent to seek legal advice to ensure there is consistency.

Funding Agreement

The Academy Trust should seek legal advice in relation to their obligations and potential liabilities under the funding agreement.

Post Conversion

Legal advice will be required on a range of issues an Academy has opened, e.g. Admissions Appeal Hearings.



Academy Pros & Cons

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Pros

- Academies are able to make more of their own decisions and decide how to spend their budget.
- Academies have the opportunity to improve
 pay and conditions for their staff.
- Within a few years of opening, an Academy is
 expected to show real progress in enhancing its
 educational environment.
- Academies will be able to enjoy more autonomy, providing more flexibility when it comes to hiring staff and admitting pupils.
- Academies can personalise their curriculum in order to suit the needs of the pupils.
- An Academy may receive additional support
 from personal or corporate sponsors, either financially or in kind.

Cons

- Some argue that there are already good examples of schools working together within their Local Authority to support one another
- There may be concern or even unrest from staff on issues like moving away from the national teacher's pay agreement
- Some argue it is not the status of the school but the school community itself which is important.
- The rights of parents and teachers in the area to choose the type of school they want for their children will be taken out of their hands.
- Academies do not have to stick to the National Curriculum, which means state funded religious academies may give preference to certain subjects and to the pupils they admit.
- Some are concerned about the power that a sponsor may have.



Becoming an Academy The Process

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Registration of Interests

The Head Teacher or Chair of Governors registers the school's interest via an on-line form with the Department for Education. The school will be assigned a contact within the Department for Education who they will liaise with them throughout the process.



Consultation

The school needs to carry out a consultation process with all interested parties to establish whether the school should become an Academy. The consultation can take place over a range of dates but it must be completed before the Funding Agreement is signed. It is up to the school how, when and who they consult with and when.



Application to Convert

If the Governing Body votes for the conversion, then an application to convert form is submitted to the Department for Education which will be reviewed by the Secretary of State.



Conversion

If the Secretary of State approves the application, he issues an Academy Order. A Trust is then set up to run the Academy on behalf of the Government. An Academy Trust is a company limited by guarantee. The role of the Trust is to oversee the running of the Academy.



Funding Agreement

This is entered into by the Academy Trust and Secretary of State. The Funding Agreement details the terms on which funding will be available and the date the Academy will open



Pre-Opening

Before the Academy opens the Trust will agree with the Local Authority the basis for the transfer of assets including terms for the transfer or lease of land from which the Academy will operate.
