Health & Safety	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• On June 4, the UAE saw 696 new cases (+21.89% from the previous day) of the coronavirus, bringing the total to 37,018 total confirmed cases. (Link)• The National Emergency Crisis and Disaster Management Authority has launched an integrated health and safety advisory outlining all precautionary measures that must be pursued across all hotel establishments to ensure the safety and wellbeing of guests. (Link)• Abu Dhabi Health Services Company (SEHA) has announced the opening of the coronavirus Prime Assessment Centers in Abu Dhabi and Al Ain with capacities of 2000 and 1500, respectively. (Link)
