

DHS Announces Expansive Deportation Immunity Plan: Hundreds of Thousands of Young Immigrants Can Expect Relief

Department of Homeland Security Announces Deportation “Immunity” for as Many as 800,000 Immigrants Who Entered the United States Illegally or Remained in the United States Beyond Their Required Departure.

The Obama Administration, in a surprising announcement, changed deportation policies, essentially granting immunity from deportation for hundreds of thousands of immigrants who are now in the United States illegally.

“Under deportation immunity plan, illegal immigrants will be immune from deportation if they were brought to the United States before they turned 16 and are younger than 30; have been in the country for at least five continuous years; have no criminal history; graduated from a U.S. high school or earned a GED or served in the military,” said **Raymond Lahoud**, an **immigration law and deportation defense attorney with Baurkot & Baurkot**. Lahoud noted that the plan permits these individuals to apply for work authorization permit.
