JUDGMENTS

Queensland

9 October 2015 - Queensland Newspapers Pty Ltd v Medical Board of Australia & Bird [2015] QCAT 422

The Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal has ordered the Medical Board of Australia (the Board) and Dr Phillip Bird (together the respondents) to file redacted versions of materials filed in the proceedings between them. The Tribunal also ordered that the original versions of the materials are not to be inspected without an order by the Tribunal.

The Tribunal made the orders in response to a successful application by Queensland Newspaper Pty Ltd (the applicant) seeking to revise previous orders prohibiting the publication of the filed material in its entirety.

Both respondents opposed the application on the basis that redaction of the material would impose a significant cost and time impost on the parties, deposing that the number of document contained in relevant medical records and reports ran over numerous folders.

The Board further submitted that the public interest served by open justice was of reduced utility in this matter because the filed material would require significant or even complete redaction. The Tribunal rejected this submission. It concluded that redaction of the material would ensure that the public interest was served, as best it could be, by open justice while also protecting confidentiality and patients' physical and mental health and safety.

Victoria

12 November 2015 - Wolstencroft v Zola (Human Rights) [2015] VCAT 1790

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has declared that a psychologist (the respondent) cannot rely on section 95(3) of the *Health Records Act 2001* (Vic) (the Act) to refuse the complainants access to their deceased son's health records.

The complainants requested access to the records in their capacity as their son's legal representative. The respondent sought to rely on section 95(3) to deny the request, stating it would be contrary to the deceased's expressed wishes to provide the access.

Section 95(2) confers a deceased person's rights under the Act to their legal representative. Section 95(3) limits those rights in relation to providing 'consent', stipulating that such consent is void if given with the knowledge or belief that the consent does not accord with the deceased's expressed wishes.

The complainants submitted, and the Tribunal agreed, that the limitation provided in section 95(3) does not apply in the current circumstances because the complainants have not sought to 'consent' to the release or disclosure of the records to a third party, but rather wish to exercise their right to 'access' the records.

Submissions made on behalf of the Australian Psychological Society expressed their concern for the implications of this conclusion, affirming:

"Release of [health records] without any consideration of the wishes of a deceased patient or client, is against the spirit of the [Act]."

The respondent further warned that individuals might be less inclined to share sensitive information with their psychologist if concerned that the information may be disclosed after their death to persons to who the individual does not want them disclosed.

20 November 2015 - Wildlife hunters beware - The NT Centre of Disease Control has issued an alert to warn wildlife hunters of the risk of leptospirosis and brucellosis, both diseases from wild animals can be acquired while hunting, butchering or skinning animals. "If you become ill with a fever within two weeks of hunting then it is important to seek medical advice for diagnosis and treatment and tell the doctor of your hunting and outdoor activities." Leptospirosis is acquired in swampy areas in the Top End, most recently near Harrison's Dam on the Adelaide River flood plain. "Lepto", as it is called, can be acquired through the skin or mouth. The initial symptoms are fever, headache, muscle pain and red eyes. Sometimes people develop a cough or jaundice (yellow eyes). Brucellosis, is associated with feral pigs and is likely acquired when skinning and gutting the animals. The symptoms are fever, sweating, headache, muscle and joint pain.

WA Health Chief Pharmacist Neil Keen said the Stimulant Regulatory Scheme had set the policy for prescribing and dispensing of stimulant medication in WA since 2003.
