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JUDGMENTS

Commonwealth. Federal Court

17 November 2015 - Burnett v Eastern Health [2015] FCA 1247

The Federal Court of Australia has made orders for an injunction to restrain Eastern Heath (the Respondent) from terminating the employment of Melissah Burnett (the Applicant). The Court also restrained the Respondent from taking any disciplinary action against the Applicant based on its prior investigations into her conduct.

The Applicant, a Nurse Unit Manager at Box Hill Hospital, applied for injunctive relief pending the hearing and determination of two claims against her employer for its alleged breach of the *Fair Work Act 2009* (Cth) (the Act).

The Applicant's first claim is that the Respondent contravened the Act by failing to follow the procedure set out in an applicable enterprise agreement when conducting its investigations into her conduct. The Applicant took particular issue with the quality of particulars provided by the Respondent to support allegations of her misconduct.

The Applicant's second claim is that the Respondent contravened the Act by taking adverse action against her after she lodged complaints to the Victorian Health Incident Management System.

To determine whether to grant the application, the Court assessed the strength of the Applicant's claim in relation to the Respondent's alleged failure to follow investigative procedures set out in the enterprise agreement. On the evidence, the Court concluded that there is a "strongly arguable case" that the Respondent did indeed fall short of the requirements under the enterprise agreement. The Court noted it's view that the Respondent needed to provide the Applicant with sufficient particulars of each allegation in order to comply it obligations.

Commonwealth. Fair Work Commission

13 November 2015 - Wilson [2015] FWC 7835

The Fair Work Commission has dismissed two applications for scope orders in relation to a proposed enterprise agreement covering medical practitioners employed by the ACT Public Service. The ACT was represented in this matter by ACT Health and Calvary Health Care Pty Ltd (the Respondents).

The applications were lodged separately by two bargaining representatives, John Wilson and Jennifer Wyborn (the Applicants), for 7 radiation oncologists and 48 senior medical practitioners (SMPs) respectively. The Applicants each sought to exclude their respective groups from the scope of the proposed enterprise agreement which otherwise proposes to cover all medical practitioners employed in the ACT Public Service.

Both Applicants argued that clear differences exist between the operation and organisation of their respective groups compared to other practitioners employed by the Respondents. On this point, ACT Health responded that the distinction between SMPs and other senior medical officers is simply one of qualifications, experience and prestige rather than "any characteristic that is relevant to their operational or organisational role".

Among the reasons cited for dismissing the applications, the Tribunal concluded that radiation oncologists and SMPs are not geographically, operationally or organisationally distinct from their colleagues under the agreement. The Tribunal also gave significant weight to the fact that neither the Australian Salaried Medical Officer's Federation ACT, nor the Australian Medical Association ACT, currently support a separate agreement for either radiation oncologists or SMPs. The Tribunal concluded that it was not satisfied that it was reasonable in the circumstances to make the scope orders sought.

17 November 2015 - Sunshine Coast interns praise award-winning emergency medicine director -Sunshine Coast's Director of Emergency Medicine has been awarded Queensland 2015 CPMEC Clinical Educator of the Year. Dr Michael Natale was nominated for the prestigious award by the 2015 intern group who attend his weekly Department of Emergency Medicine education sessions at both Nambour General Hospital and Caloundra Emergency Department.

Antibiotic Awareness Week, which is endorsed by the World Health Organisation and coordinated locally by NPS MedicineWise, is aimed at getting all Australians to play a part in addressing the threat of antimicrobial resistance. AuMA President, Professor Brian Owler, said today that when antibiotics are taken unnecessarily or incorrectly, it encourages the development of dangerous antibiotic-resistant bacteria.

19 November 2015 - City dwellers hold up bulk billing rate - The bulk billing rate is continuing to climb despite the Federal Government's four-year Medicare rebate freeze, underlining concerns about the increasing financial pressure on the nation's GPs. Eighty-three per cent of standard GP visits were bulk billed last financial year, up from 82.2 per cent in 2013-14, and 10 percentage points higher than a decade before. Sydneysiders were the most likely to be bulk billed – more than 96 per cent of GP visits in western and south-west Sydney were covered entirely by the Medicare rebate, compared with around 84 per cent in Melbourne, 83 per cent in Adelaide, about 80 per cent in Brisbane, 76 per cent in Perth, and just 57 per cent in Canberra – the nation's lowest reading.
