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KEY DECISIONS

6 October 2017 - *Pere v Central Queensland Hospital and Health Service* [2017] QCA 225 - PROFESSIONS AND TRADES – HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS – MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS – LIABILITY IN TORT – GENERAL PRINCIPLES, and EMPLOYMENT LAW – LIABILITY AT COMMON LAW FOR INJURY AT WORK – CAUSATION AND FORESEEABILITY – CAUSATION.

Mr Pere was employed as a Fire Safety and Security Officer at the Gladstone Hospital. During a shift, he was observed to be acting in an unusual manner and was directed to the Emergency Department. The treating doctor ordered a blood test and urine test to screen for alcohol and illicit substances. According to the doctor, Mr Pere was calm and did not object or resist to the tests being carried out. Mr Pere said that he was 'poked' with the needle and did not consent to giving blood, and that when he gave his urine sample a nurse was present and looked at his genitalia. He said that these circumstances had caused him shame and humiliation, leading to him suffering from depression and anxiety, which had an adverse impact on his income earning capacity. The Court doubted the credibility of Mr Pere's testimony and stated that the medical evidence did not establish a probable connection between the event and Mr Pere's ongoing psychological disturbance. As such, the claims for assault, battery and negligence were not made out. Mr Pere sought to appeal this decision, claiming that consent to the tests was not 'freely given' because there was a power imbalance between him and his employer. The Court found that there was no evidence that he was deprived of capacity to consent, and that he was not ordered to undergo the tests as an employee but a patient. Leave to appeal was denied.

26 September 2017 - *Inquest into the Death of Jared Charles Olsen* Ref No: 20/16- Mr Olsen died at Fiona Stanley Hospital, Murdoch, as a result of fulminant sepsis (Klebsiella pneumoniae) with multi-organ failure complicating severe pancytopenia following the administration of 6-Mercaptopurine in a man with acute severe exacerbation of chronic colitis (Crohn's) and TPMT deficiency.

Mr Olsen was treated at Fiona Stanley Hospital (FSH) for Crohn's colitis with the immunosuppressant medication 6-MP. He was unable to metabolise it, which led to 6-MP toxicity and profound bone marrow suppression, ultimately resulting in his death. Coroner Fogliani found that FSH missed a number of opportunities to detect and avert the 6-MP toxicity, as they electronically received significantly abnormal test results but, due to both system and human error, no clinician became aware of them. The Coroner highlighted the risks for patients when too much reliance is placed on electronic communications in an environment where clinicians routinely work on rotation and in teams, and noted that different hospitals have different practices in relation to testing. Further, many of the experts consulted by the Coroner during the inquest recommended that TPMT enzyme testing be done prior to treatment with drugs such as 6-MP. The Coroner recommended that FSH put in place its own internal robust systems for tracking lists of patients in iCM for whom tests have been ordered and received, including for patients that have been discharged, and those systems facilitate the conveyance of test results to the consultant in charge of the patient's treatment and highlight urgent/abnormal test results, rather than requiring the clinicians to chase up results. The Coroner also recommended that the Department of Health consider whether an operational directive or instruction is required to support governance within public hospitals regarding the implementation of systems for tracking test results, particularly where patients have been discharged.
