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JUDGMENTS

New South Wales

17 September 2014 - Southern Radiology Nuclear Medicine v Environmental Protection Authority (EPA) [2014] NSWCATAD 145

Southern Radiology (the Applicant) is a medical imaging provider. One of the Applicant's practices was inspected by EPA officers. An undisclosed third party sought documents from the EPA evidencing reports on lost radiation sources and unauthorised radiation practices. The EPA advised Southern Radiology that it was proposing to release some of these documents that related to Southern Radiology. Southern Radiology objected under the *Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009.*

The Applicant submitted that the documents had the potential to prejudice its legitimate business, commercial, professional or financial interests. It argued that if the documents were released to the third party, its previous non-compliance with relevant legislation would be used to damage its reputation and its business would consequently be at a disadvantage.

The Applicant accepted that there is a general public interest in providing individuals with access to government information in order to achieve a number of legitimate ends. However, it contended that in this case, disclosure of the documents could reasonably be expected to prejudice the Applicant's legitimate business, commercial, professional and financial interests. It submitted that the public interest considerations in favour of disclosure do not outweigh those against disclosure as is required by the Act.

The Respondent argued, amongst other things, that the documents proved that Southern Radiology had rectified its former non-compliance with legislation and it is now fully compliant. The Court agreed and held that the Applicant did not establish an overriding public interest against disclosure of the information. It was not contrary to the Act to release the documents.

Victoria

10 September 2014 - Finding into Death with Inquest of John William Macfie COR 2014 1261

At the time of his death, Mr Macfie was a prisoner in Victoria. This matter was therefore a mandatory inquest. Mr Macfie had a past medical history of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease, hypertension, hyperlipidemia, ischaemic heart disease and two coronary artery bypass graft surgeries. He was also a chronic smoker.

From late September 2011 until the time of his death in March 2014, Mr Macfie experienced significant ongoing pain in relation to his lungs. He presented to the nurse clinic at Port Phillip Prison on a number of occasions during that period, however he refused to undergo CT scans as recommended. He refused to attend over ten medical appointments, and despite significant efforts by his treating practitioners to warn him of the risks of non-compliance with his treatment plan and non-attendance at medical appointments, on occasion he also refused to engage in these discussions.

On 1 October 2013, Mr Macfie stated that he did not 'want further investigations, ICU admission and CPR' and he signed a 'Not for Resuscitation' form. He then commenced palliative care.

The Coroner was satisfied that the medical management and care provided by St Vincent's Hospital and the relevant correctional facilities was reasonable and appropriate in the circumstances. Mr Macfie had made an independent decision not to have further medical investigation or intervention despite the health staff having taken all necessary steps to make Mr Macfie aware of the risks of non-compliance with his treatment plan and non-attendance at medical appointments. The Court made no recommendations in this case.
