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JUDGMENTS

Australia. Family Court

22 May 2015 - Re Ashley [2015] FamCA 37

The Family Court has found that a 17 year old child is competent to consent to cross-sex hormone treatment for his gender identity dysphoria. The Court held that Ashley was able to fully understand the proposed treatment, and to give his informed consent for it to be carried out.

The Court noted that while Ashley was born female, he has identified as male from an early age. The Court heard evidence from Ashley's family, and staff from the hospital where he proposes to undergo treatment. It found there was no controversy about Ashley's diagnosis or wishes, and that all persons involved in Ashley's care were supportive of his desire to undergo treatment.

The Court noted that Ashley's family feared for his mental health if he could not have the hormone treatment. It noted evidence from medical staff in relation to higher risks of mental health issues and self-harm among young people with gender identity dysphoria.

The Court noted that although it has power under the *Family Law Act 1975* (Cth) to authorise medical treatment of children, it was not necessary to make an order in this case because Ashley was competent to make his own decision about the treatment.

The Court made an order that Ashley is competent to consent to specified medical treatment, including hormone treatment as recommended by his paediatrician or psychiatrist. The Court noted that this form of order would not present any difficulties for Ashley in receiving treatment from the relevant hospital.

Victoria

28 May 2015 - Inquest into the death of Naomi Charmain Mahon COR 2011 001282

The Victorian Coroners Court has investigated the circumstances surrounding Ms Mahon's death, finding that she intentionally took her own life and that psychiatric illness and the effects of cannabis had contributed to her death.

Immediately prior to her death, Ms Mahon had been apprehended by Victoria Police under section 10 of the *Mental Health Act 1986* (Vic) as a person likely to harm herself, and was transported to Monash Medical Centre. Psychiatric staff at the hospital decided to admit Ms Mahon, but while they were momentarily facing away, Ms Mahon absconded. Hospital staff notified police, who located the deceased after she had already committed suicide.

John Snowden appeared at the inquest on behalf of Monash Health. No adverse findings were made against the hospital, and the coroner held that there was no evidence to support a finding that any want of clinical care on the part of the medical staff had caused or contributed to Ms Mahon's death.

In her findings, the Coroner acknowledged the new *Mental Health Act 2014* (Vic), which introduces fresh criteria for involuntary treatment and revises the assessment and treatment order process. The Coroner noted that:

'While it remains to be seen how the 2014 Act will operate in practice, it is hoped that the treatment and engagement of people such as Ms Mahon can be improved, and that the number of deaths in similar circumstances to those in which Ms Mahon died, can be reduced.'
