- **Children**. It is crucial that all parents name a guardian for their minor children in the event both parents die. Additionally, through an estate plan involving a trust, you can stagger financial inheritance distributions or otherwise dictate how and when your children will receive their inheritance.
- **Retirement.** At this point in your life, it is important to review all of your finances, including your estate plan.
- **Divorce or death**. If you get a divorce or your spouse dies, you will want to review your documents to insure that they still reflect your intentions. You may want to remove your ex-spouse from being your power of attorney, health care proxy, or as a beneficiary of your assets.
- **Remarriage**. If you and your new spouse have children from previous marriages, you must insure that your estate plan reflects your intentions and insure that all children are provided for as intended.
- **Significant financial changes**. As you proceed through life, your assets tend to grow and accumulate. It is important that you review your estate plan in comparison with the value of your estate to shelther assets from estate taxes.
