(Link) UAE's Group 42 and UK's Oxford Nanopore co-develop ultra-scalable solution for coronavirus detection. The end-to-end solution will be officially launched within weeks. (Link) Dubai Silicon Oasis Authority partners with Derq to deploy AI-based solutions to monitor adherence to coronavirus guidelines.
