

Do These 3 Things After a Wreck

Driving itself can be considered dangerous just by its very nature. However, some drivers make road conditions worse by driving carelessly. Right after a wreck unfolds; there are several things you can do to prepare while waiting on the police to make it to the scene. After deciphering if everyone involved is okay, take these next three steps:

1. Always Wait for the Authorities

If no one is injured, it may take them a while to show up. Wait it out. Having a police officer document the wreck is imperative if you end up wanting to sue the driver and a [car accident lawyer](#) will have a much easier time representing you if you get as much evidence to shore up your case as possible. There is also the fact that running away from the scene of a wreck is a crime, of course, and it's not something you want to do.

2. Lawyer First, Insurance Second

Contact a lawyer before you start dealing with your insurance company. Don't contact your insurer from the scene of the wreck. There's a good chance that, simply because you'll be very agitated and nervous, you'll say something wrong. Be certain that you speak with your lawyer, and then call the insurance company afterward. Your insurance company, if they can avoid doing so, will most certainly not want to pay any claims.

3. Stay Calm

If the driver who caused the wreck was intoxicated or just extremely negligent, it's easy to let your temper get away from you. This is the last thing you will want to do. You may need to back away from the other driver to avoid confrontations. Its best practice to only discuss injuries with the other driver.

A car wreck is always a stressful situation but, provided that you handle it correctly, you can talk to an attorney to see if you have options for filing a lawsuit. Doing so may make it possible to recover the damages you incurred as a result of the wreck and ensures that drivers who are negligent don't get to cause people pain and suffering, as well as injuries, and just walk away without being held responsible for it.
