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JUDGMENTS

New South Wales

O'Sullivan v Medical Council of New South Wales [2015] NSWCATAD 113

The New South Wales Civil and Administrative Tribunal has set aside decisions made by the Medical Council of New South Wales (Council) not to disclose certain information to Dr Brendan O'Sullivan.

Dr O'Sullivan applied to the Council under the *Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009* (NSW) for access to a number of documents, including authorship details of a document that had previously been provided to him by the Council.

While the Council disclosed some of the requested documents, it withheld other information on the basis that there was a public interest consideration weighing against disclosure. The Council considered that if Dr O'Sullivan was given certain information, it could expose Council staff to a risk of harm, harassment or intimidation.

The Tribunal held that the evidence did not indicate this consideration was so significant as to outweigh the general public interest in favour of disclosure. The Tribunal noted the long, acrimonious history between the parties. It also noted that Dr O'Sullivan had sought access to the information for a book he is writing about his dealings with the Council, so that his record is accurate and complete. The Tribunal noted that while it was possible that the publication of the book could cause embarrassment to current or former employees of the Council, Dr O'Sullivan's motivations were understandable and uncontroversial.

The Tribunal set aside decisions made by the Council to withhold, or partially withhold, a number of documents and ordered that certain requested information be disclosed.

Western Australia

Solomon v Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency [2015] WASC 203

The Supreme Court of Western Australia has quashed a decision made by a professional standards panel (Panel) of the Psychology Board of Australia that the applicant behaved in a way that constituted unsatisfactory professional performance. It also quashed the panel's further decision to caution the applicant and impose conditions on her registration.

The Court found multiple reasons to quash the decisions, including that the inadequacy of reasons constituted an error of law on the face of the record. The Court held that the reasons given by the Panel for their decision were not "reasons for the decision" as required by section 192(3)(b) of the *Health Practitioner Regulation National Law*. The Court found that the Panel's reasons did not explain its reasoning process in coming to its decision, and did not disclose how the Panel had resolved factual inconsistencies between the parties' evidence.

The Court found further that the Panel had misunderstood the statutory provisions of the *National Law* which were the source of its jurisdiction, and misconceived the nature of its function, which amounted to a jurisdictional error.

The Court made a number of observations about the panel's process, including that it was "highly undesirable" for the panel to receive concurrent submissions relating to whether the unsatisfactory conduct had occurred, and what the penalty should be if the conduct was established. The Court stated that in any case where the practitioner denies engaging in such conduct, the appropriate penalty should be decided at a subsequent hearing.

Shortly after making an apology to those who were impacted by the forced adoption practices of the past, the previous Liberal Government introduced "contact statements" that restricted natural parents from contacting their adult adopted children, if the child lodged a statement specifying "no contact". But the statements are only available to adult adoptees, not natural parents. And it is a criminal offence to breach a no contact statement. Natural parents, particularly women who had their children forcibly removed, regarded the contact statements as hurtful and discriminatory as they only targeted parents. Under the changes introduced to Parliament today, adult adoptees, natural parents and other parties will still be able to express their wishes regarding contact and the sharing of personal information, and have those wishes recorded on the Adoption Information Register.

10 June 2015 - Warning for patients of unregistered dentist - Patients of a man purporting to be a dentist in Melbourne's northern suburbs have been urged to contact the Department of Health & Human Services. This follows charges laid by the Australian Health Practitioner Regulation Agency (AHPRA) against the man, who has allegedly been providing dental treatment without being registered. The alleged "practice" was located at a residential property in Rocklands Rise, Meadow Heights. "We are concerned that patients who received dental care from this individual at this premises may have contracted a blood borne infection as a result of poor infection control practices", Victoria's Acting Chief Health Officer, Dr Finn Romanes, said.

10 June 2015 - Northern health hub chosen for Barwon Health-North - The new \$33 million Barwon Health-North facility will be built in Norlane as part of Geelong's new Northern Arts, Recreation and Community Health and Wellbeing Hub. Barwon Health-North will provide a range of community-based health care services, and will include medical imaging services including x-ray facilities, a CT scanner, a pathology centre, a pharmacy, and consulting suites. It will also include an urgent care centre, offering non-emergency patients with an alternative to a hospital emergency department, and will provide same-day medical services such as renal dialysis.

9 June 2015 - **Boost to family violence counselling services** - Survivors of family violence will receive more support as the Andrews Labor Government's \$3.5 million boost to counselling services across the state begins to flow this week, Minister for Families and Children, Jenny Mikakos, announced today. The funding will see the recruitment of an additional 22 full-time equivalent counselling staff who will provide an extra 40,000 hours of counselling across Victoria. This will make it easier for women and children who have experienced family violence to access timely therapeutic support, helping them to recover.

7 June 2015 - Planning starts on Australia's first heart hospital - The Andrews Labor Government will build a specialist heart hospital at Monash University in Clayton, bringing together the world's best in cardiovascular care, research and training. The Victorian Heart Hospital will treat cardiac diseases from early childhood to advanced adult life, and will include an emergency department, cardiac cath labs, specialist surgical and imaging facilities, and telehealth services for patients across Victoria, interstate and around the world.
